How will my pet be affected by secondhand smoke?

Cancer- some animals are more likely to have lung cancer, others will get nasal cancer
Asthma- wheezing, coughing, difficulty breathing
Allergies- that may involve constant scratching, runny nose or eyes, hair loss, dry skin
Lung disorders- cancer, problems breathing
Respiratory problems- caged pets are especially prone to this health problem

How will my pet be affected if they ingest tobacco products?

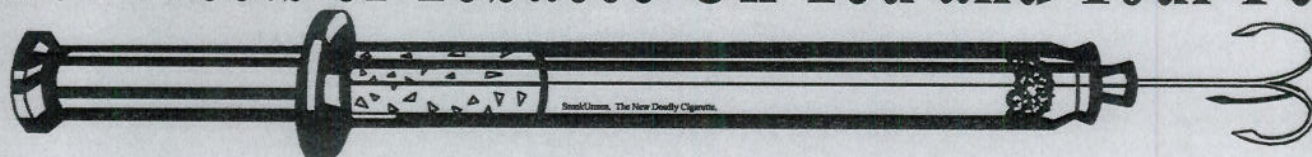
If your pet chews or swallows tobacco products they may have the following side effects: vomiting, diarrhea, and stomach upset.

DEATH is also possible if a pet consumes tobacco products or tobacco waste.

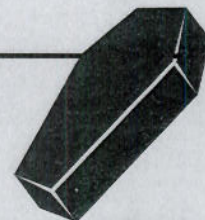


Tobacco Companies Lie.

Carbon Monoxide- (is color-
less, odorless highly poisonous gas put out
from automobiles)



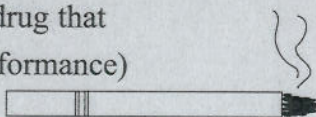
Ammonia- (used in household
